**02.380.015:** Consideration of findings and recommendations of Personal Hearing Committee (PHC) held on 21.10.2022 in respect of following institutions –

- 1) Anjali College Of Pharmacy & Sciences Agra Firozabad Road Nh 2 Etmadpur Agra 283202(UttarPradesh) PCI-104
- 2) Lingaya's Vidyapeeth, Nachauli, Jasana - Old Faridabad Road, Faridabad-121002 (Haryana) by Shri Saurabh Dahiya Associate Professor, DIPSAR-DPSRU. (PCI-461/2020)
- 3) Rungta Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Research, Rungta Knowledge City, Kohka Kurud Road, Kurud Bhilai, Durg-490024(Chhattisgarh) (PCI-4629)
- 4) Rungta Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Rungta Knowledge City, Kohka-Kurud Road,Bhilai,Durg490024(Chhattisgarh)(PCI-3868).

15.1 The latest information on record was placed.

15.2 It was decided to ratify the composition of PHC and observer.

15.3 The following decisions have been taken -

A) Anjali College of Pharmacy & Sciences Agra Firozabad Road Nh 2 Etmadpur Agra 283202 (Uttar Pradesh) PCI-104

1. The latest information on record including the findings of PHC dt.21.10.2022 was placed and considered.

2. It was noted that PHC has pointed out as under -

Regarding faculty

- a) Institute has reported that total 25 faculty members are presently working in Anjali college of Pharmacy and Science. Out of these, only 18 faculty members including the Principal were present before the PHC. Out of these eighteen faculty members present, only 10 faculty members as per IR were present and 08 newly appointed faculty members (who have joined after the last inspection held on 10th and 11th September 2022) were present.
- b) The Institute submitted leave applications of remaining 07 faculty members. During vetting, it was found that the leave applications were not signed by the faculty members or the signatures of the faculty members on leave application were not matching with the signature as presented in SDF submitted.
- c) Dr. Mihir Y. Parmar appeared in the capacity of New Principal before the PHC. He has joined the institute on 17.10.2022. His total teaching experience is 14 Years 07 Months and 25 Days against the required experience for Principal as 15 Years. He could not produce the relieving letter from previous institute i.e. Sanjay College of Pharmacy, Mathura.

- d) Dr. Pawan Kumar was present as a Professor but his teaching experience was not adequate for professor i.e. 10 Years as per submitted documents. Many documents were blurred and not clearly legible. He submitted an Experience certificate submitted from Sundardeep College of Pharmacy mentioning the experience w.e.f. 11th July 2012 to 24th December 2021. During careful vetting of the document, it was found that the date of issue of the experience certificate was 28th February 2017. On pointing out, he corrected it with pen before the PHC but failed to produce the original experience certificate.
- e) Mr.Kris Jain's joining report mentioned in SDF 19.07.2022 is whereas the joining date mentioned in joining report is 25.07.2022. Designation mentioned in SDF is Associate Professor whereas designation mentioned on joining letter is Assistant Professor.
- f) Regarding Ms.Rekha Rani - Copy of the relieving letter issued by KDC College of Pharmacy, Mathura submitted by the candidate has overwriting in the date of resignation as well as date of relieving. The candidate was asked to produce/show the original documents but failed to do so.

g) General Comments

- i) Documents submitted along with SDF of many faculty members were blurred and not legibly readable.
- ii) Faculty members/institute has failed to show the original academic qualification documents, experience certificates, other relevant documents. Only photocopies of some documents were enclosed with SDF.
- iii) The institute has failed to produce the proof of salary paid as per norms as No Form 16/ITR receipt, etc. were presented as a proof of salary paid to the faculty members.  
Many faculty members including the Principal, Professor, etc. was not having the requisite experience.

h) Regarding Complaint Submitted by Dr. Nitesh Kumar Sharma

The complainant has submitted that the notarization of the affidavit submitted has been done before purchase of the stamp papers. The institute has submitted in their representation in writing saying that Dr. Nitesh Kumar Sharma has misplaced the first page of the affidavit deliberately. The principal has submitted in writing that he has joined recently and only management will respond to this point.

i) Recommendations of Personal Hearing Committee (PHC):-

Considering the above facts, it was recommended as under:-

- The newly appointed Principal Dr. Mihir Y. Parmar does not fulfill the minimum teaching experience criteria.
- The institute has failed to produce the documentary evidence of the salary paid as per norms, and institute has failed to maintain the faculty cadre ratio.

- Leave applications submitted by the institute do not bear the signature of the concerned faculty or the signatures do not match with signatures mentioned in SDF.
- Signature and stamps of the principal (Dr. Deepak) on many of the documents are exactly matching. The matter needs further investigation to establish the originality of the signatures of the concerned.
- Regarding complaint related to the affidavit submitted, the institute has submitted their representation in writing. Since, the matter involves some matter related to signature on the duly stamped undertaking, appropriate legal opinion may be taken in this regard by PCI and the matter may be proceeded accordingly.

3. In view of above, it was decided to -

- a) instruct the institution not to make admission from 2022-2023 academic session.
- b) it was further decided to seek clarification from the Management on Principal's letter dt.21.10.2022 submitted to PHC with regard to signatures of Shri Nitesh Kumar Sharma.

B) Lingaya's Vidyapeeth, Nachauli, Jasana - Old Faridabad Road, Faridabad-121002 (Haryana) by Shri Saurabh Dahiya Associate Professor, DIPSAR-DPSRU. (PCI-461/2020)

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1. The latest information on record including the findings of PHC dt.21.10.2022 was placed and considered.
2. The PHC noted that matter with regard to payment of pending salary has been resolved amicably between the complainant and the institute.
3. It was noted that D.Pharm and B.Pharm courses are already approved upto 2022-2023 academic session.
4. In view of above, it was decided that findings of PHC be sent to college as well as to the complainant.

C) Rungta Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Research, Rungta Knowledge City, Kohka Kurud Road, Kurud Bhilai, Durg- 490024(Chhattisgarh) (PCI-4629)

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1. The latest information on record including the findings of PHC dt.21.10.2022 was placed and considered.
2. The PHC noted that -
  - a) The total land assigned to each institute is as under:
    - Rungta Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Research : 2.02 Acres

- b) The available land as per the records produced is sufficient to run the courses as per PCI norms.

1. The latest information on record including order dt.20.10.2022 passed by Hon'ble Delhi High Court was placed and considered.
2. It was noted that -
  - a) Institution is running D.Pharm course since 2019.
  - b) Institution was inspected in September, 2021 which revealed huge deficiencies particularly with regard to non availability of -
    - Principal.
    - teaching faculty.
    - equipments.
    - gas connection and other infrastructural facilities.
    - chemicals and glassware.
    - non maintenance of record particularly regarding documentary evidence of having conducted the classes.
    - no practicals were held and attendance was fabricated etc.
  - c) Institution was given an opportunity to appear before the Personal Hearing Committee (PHC) of PCI on 13.12.2021 but it failed to provide documentary evidence with regard to compliance of the deficiencies pointed out in 2021 inspection report.
  - d) In view of it, PCI issued notice u/s 13 for withdrawal of approval further instructing the institution –
    - i) not to make admissions from 2022-2023 academic session.
    - ii) forward their representation, if any, through the State Government within 3 months of receipt of the notice as required u/s 13 of the Pharmacy Act, 1948 failing which Council shall be constrained to withdraw approval u/s 13.
  - e) The institution failed to submit representation through the State Government.

- f) Inadvertently, the institution was inspected by the PCI in July, 2022. The July 2022 inspection report has again revealed the following deficiencies (deficiencies pointed out in the last inspection report were not rectified) -
- i) Principal was not appointed as per statutory provisions of “The Education Regulations, 2020 for Diploma Course in Pharmacy”. Only appointment order is shown and not the joining report.
  - ii) 2 lecturers with B.Pharm qualification claimed to have been appointed in the SIF submitted to PCI were not available at the time of inspection.
  - iii) Museum is not available.
  - iv) Seminar hall is not available.
  - v) Data with regard to number of classes in practicals is not available.
  - vi) Data with regard to percentage of faculty retention is not available.
  - vii) Equipments are deficient.
  - viii) Institution failed to provide the CCTV footage to ensure whether the candidates were present in the tests.
  - ix) Grievance register is not maintained.
  - x) Books are deficient.
  - xi) Faculty did not attend any seminar.
  - xii) Model pharmacy lab is not available.
  - xiii) Laboratories are not properly arranged.
  - xiv) First aid room is not available etc.
3. It was noted that the course of study of this institution does not continue to be in conformity with the statutory provisions of -
- a) Education Regulations, 1991 for the Diploma course in Pharmacy.
  - b) The Education Regulations, 2020 for Diploma Course in Pharmacy.
  - c) Minimum Qualification for Teachers in Pharmacy Institutions Regulations, 2014.
4. In view of above, it was decided as under -
- a) notice u/s 13 of the Pharmacy Act, 1948 for withdrawal of approval will remain in force and institution be advised -
    - i) not to make admissions from 2022-2023 academic session.
    - ii) forward their representation, if any, through the State Government per return of mail.
  - b) it was further decided to convey the above decision to all concerned in compliance of order dt.20.10.2022 passed by Hon’ble Delhi High Court by 1.11.2022 positively.
5. It was further noted that -
- a) 115 CC (May, 2022) issued notice u/s 13 to several insititotns further advising them not to make admissions from 2022-2023 academic session and forward their representation through the State Governrment within 3 months failing which Council shall be constrained to withdraw approval u/s 13.

- b) subsequently the EC gave a very clear policy on notice u/s 13 cases. As per the said policy, wherever representation through the State Government is not received, inspections were not to be conducted.
- c) However, it has been noted that in respect of this institution representation through the State Government was not received but an inspection was arranged in disregard to the policy of the EC.

**30.3 B) W.P.(C) 10326/2022 & CM APPLs. 29770/2022, 30345/2022 filed by Jeeramani Jagdeesh Institute of Pharmacy Vs Union of India and Ors.**
