The Regulation-9. of the said Regulations prescribes the nomenclature of Postgraduate pharmacy courses which shall be as prescribed under Appendix-A to these Regulations. c) Diploma in Pharmacy course (D.Pharm) is regulated by the statutory provisions of the Education Regulations, 1991 for Diploma course in Pharmacy. The PCI does not grant approval above 60 admissions in D.Pharm course.
