Sub: Comments of the State Governments /Union Territories on the proposed amendment in the regulations 3 of the Pharmacy Practice Regulations- 2015 and the Pharmacy Practice (Amendment) Regulations, 2021.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject cited above, it is informed that -

- 1. The Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) is a statutory body working under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, New Delhi. It is constituted under the Pharmacy Act, 1948 to regulate the profession and practice of pharmacy in the country.
- 2. With due approval of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India, the PCI has notified the Pharmacy Practice Regulations- 2015 in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary No. 17, Part III, Section- 4, dt. 16.1.2015 and Pharmacy Practice (Amendment) Regulations, 2021 in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary No. 276, Part III, Section- 4, dt. 05.07.2021. These Regulations are available on the Council's website www.pci.nic.in.
- 3. The 357th Executive Committee of the PCI in its meeting held in January, 2022 decided to recommend to the Council to include M.Pharm (Pharmacy Practice) as one of the qualification under para 3. (i) of Pharmacy Practice Regulations, 2015 as notified in the Gazette of India, No.276, Part III Section 4, dt.5.7.2021 i.e. the following amendment be done in the Pharmacy Practice Regulations, 2015 -
